



## TERMS OF REFERENCE PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES COVID-19 AND PROTECTED AREAS TASK FORCE

### Background

The COVID-19 pandemic is an acute health crisis with economic, political, social and environmental implications. These factors are already impacting protected and conserved areas (PCAs) and these impacts will grow in both the short and longer term. PCAs also have an important role to play in the prevention of ecosystem degradation and zoonosis and in maintaining essential ecosystem services upon which people depend for their health and well-being. There is now a strong case for greater investments and profile for PCAs in the emerging plans for green recovery. WCPA needs to respond to this situation by providing advice, coordination and leadership specific to the current pandemic, including collation and dissemination of good practice, and in advocating best practices for maintaining the essential life support systems of ecosystems.

### Purpose of Task Force/Specialist Group

The overall aim of the task force is to collate information and insights on the impacts of COVID-19 on protected and conserved areas and to collate and disseminate principles and good practice for rescue, recovery, and rebuilding to strengthen and expand systems of protected and conserved areas which contribute to human health and welfare

### Integration in GPAP/WCPA's Quadrennial Programme 2017-2020 (describe but also use checklist below to indicate which areas are covered)

Actions of the Task Force will contribute directly to communicate the values of PCAs in helping societies to cope with and recover from Covid-19 and other pandemics. As we work to place PCAs as central pieces in the national government's recovery plans, we expect to make direct contributions to programme area 3 – by emphasising the role of PCAs as nature-based solutions and advocating for plans and commitments that take this into consideration. It is anticipated that stronger links will be made to the IUCN Programme for 2021-2024 when this is approved and to the post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework.

- Short briefing papers prepared, including operating procedures for the management of protected and conserved areas during pandemics (particularly with regard to visitor management); the role and value of protected and conserved areas and how they can contribute to a One Health approach; the role of protected and conserved areas in building back better for a more sustainable future
- Provide WCPA input to IUCN policy positions and programmes and recommended best practices on strengthening PA systems in the face of the public health and economic crisis of a global pandemic

The Task Force will also rely on the support of the WCPA Regional Vice-Chairs to engage regional members as it seeks to monitor and understand the impacts of COVID-19 and disseminate information and facilitate the identification of national/regional solutions and commitments.</p> <p>The Task Force will seek global representation of WCPA membership and diverse scientific expertise relevant to its goals.</p>
<p><b>Partnerships, funding and fund-raising</b></p> <p>Potential partners beyond IUCN include: NGOs (WWF, CI, others), ICCA Consortium, CBD secretariat, regional PA initiatives (Asian Protected Area Partnership, RedParques..)</p> <p>The Task Force will seek funding to support some activities, which will mainly include producing technical and communication materials and targeted guidance to address specific issues.</p>
<p><b>Communication</b></p> <p>The Task Force communication strategy is focused to three main audiences which will be reached by different channels/materials:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- WCPA and other conservation practitioners through: social media, IUCN channels, Protected Planet Newsletter, blog posts, technical notes and briefings</li> <li>- Protected Area Practitioners: technical briefings, webinars</li> <li>- Experts and researchers: Parks Special Issue</li> <li>- High-level decision makers: key messages, bilateral calls, key events and online petitions</li> </ul>
<p><b>Reporting</b></p> <p>The advances and results of the Task Force will be reported in WCPA annual technical reports. The TF will also communicate regularly with the Chair, WCPA, the WCPA Steering Committee and the IUCN Secretariat focal point (GPAP).</p> <p>The Task Force will hold internal calls (every 2 or 3 months) to report progress and discuss relevant issues with its members.</p>
