### Vjosa, one of our last wild rivers, becomes Europe's first Wild River National Park

On 15 March, the Vjosa River in Albania, one of the last wild rivers of Europe is declared a National Park by the Albanian Government, becoming the first Wild River National Park in Europe.

This is the result of a unique collaboration between the Albanian Government, local and international experts, environmental NGOs from the Save the Blue Heart of Europe campaign, IUCN (International Union for Conservation of Nature), and outdoor clothing company Patagonia.

## Restoration of Motley Island: engaging the local community to restore native peatland habitats

Habitat loss and soil erosion are of major conservation concern in the Falkland Islands. Originally caused by deliberate burning by early sealers and subsequently by stock over-grazing in an environment without native land mammals and climate change.

In 2020, through a grant to Falklands Conservation to address coastal peatland erosion on Motley Island, BEST 2.0+ recognised the need to reverse this loss and to build community capacity for habitat restoration activities.

## IUCN Green List – Supporting a Framework for Capacity Building in the Coral Triangle, Asia Pacific

In March 2023, a regional workshop was held in Bali, Indonesia to explore the development of a marine conservation and protected areas (MCPA) capacity development programme for

the Coral Triangle region, Asia Pacific, based on the IUCN Green List Framework.

The workshop was co-hosted by the Coral Triangle Center (CTC), a regional training hub for the six nations that form the coral triangle countries — Indonesia, Malaysia, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Solomon Islands and Timor-Leste — which together host the most marine biodiverse ecosystems on the planet.

## Envisioning the implementation of the IUCN Green List of Protected and Conserved Areas until 2030

The Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation (GBMF) has awarded the International Union for the Conservation of Nature a grant to support the implementation of the Green List Programme until 2030, with the objective of implementing the new Global Biodiversity Framework Targets and the 30x30 ambitions to secure biodiversity and climate benefits and catalysing the scale-up of the IUCN Green List in all dimensions.

#### Zambia Celebrates its first Green Listed site!

North Luangwa National Park is one of Zambia's pristine wilderness landscapes and home to Zambia's only Black Rhino population. This 4636Km2 park has rich and thriving wildlife populations and a spectacular untouched wilderness.

The North Luangwa Conservation Programme (NLCP), a 37-year partnership between Frankfurt Zoological Society (FZS) and the Zambian Department of National Parks and Wildlife (DNPW), successfully met the rigorous requirements, as defined by the IUCN Green List

for Protected and Conserved Areas, to achieve fair and effective conservation measures and thus were awarded their Green List certification by IUCN.

## Clarita, a process of hope and teamwork in a post-COVID world

As the pandemic hit Perú, the country closed as many others around the world. Communities like Santa Rosa in the buffer zone of the Rio Abiseo National Park were left alone. Clarita's small business got hit and the family economy collapsed. They were left to fend for themselves, and Clarita experienced the most painful moment of her life as her husband became victim of the virus and died.

Her journey, as a single mother in the midst of a pandemic begun and as communities and countries started to open their borders again, she was faced with the dilemma of how to care for her son and maintain the household economy afloat.

IUCN, and the German Government through GIZ, joined forces with our implementing partner Planeterra to build the "Sustainable Tourism and Protected Areas in a Post-COVID World" project in Perú and Vietnam, responding to the impacts of the pandemic. As part of the implementing activities, communities in the Rio Abiseo National Park and the Amarakaeri Communal Reserve created Community Action Plans, prioritizing and developing sustainable community tourism products realized through the Cash for Work mechanism.

Her story enables us to understand the pillars of a community-based project in a more organic and human way.





# Sustainable Tourism: a ray of hope and a long-term vision for local communities and conservation in protected and conserved areas

In closing the project "Sustainable Tourism and Protected Areas in a Post-COVID World", two indigenous communities were visited in Amarakaeri Communal Reserve, Shintuya and Queros, while the leaders of the other three communities participating in the project, Puerto Azul, Boca Isiriwe and Baranco Chico, were invited to join the closing meeting in Queros community.

The aim of the project was to engage local indigenous peoples from these communities in restoring and developing new sustainable community-based tourism action plans and itineraries, especially favouring women's participation and benefit. Through a dedicated 'cash for work' scheme, local people affected by the COVID-19 pandemic were able to earn a supplementary income by, for example, restoring trails in Queros, restoring community centres where visitors are welcomed (Puerto Azul, Boca Isiriwe), tree planting (Baranco Chico) or by enhancing sanitation and waste management infrastructure in Shintuya. 126 community members directly benefited (53 men, 73 women) and 240 people indirectly benefited from these activities.

#### Training on the IUCN Guidelines for Disease Risk Reduction in PCAs and One Health Principles for Sustainable Tourism in Vietnam

In September 2022 several partners organized a training to strengthen disease risk reduction and One Health coordination capacity for protected area managers in Vietnam. This training, coorganised by IUCN secretariat and IUCN Vietnam, Save Vietnam's Wildlife (SVW), Conservation Medicine and EcoHealth Alliance focused on IUCN guidelines for disease prevention, detection, response and recovery in

protected and conserved areas (PCAs) and One Health best practice guidance for sustainable and healthy tourism in Vietnam. The training was led by experts from Conservation Medicine, an NGO based in Malaysia and a leader in applied wildlife health and disease surveillance, risk assessment, and biosafety processes.

## FAM Trips in the Río Abiseo National Park and Amarakaeri Communal Reserve to promote local tourism experiences

As part of the Sustainable Tourism and Protected Areas in a Post-COVID World project, IUCN and Planeterra worked with the communities of Río Abiseo National Park and Amarakaeri Communal Reserve in Peru to develop community-based tourism enterprises and connect them with the travel market.

One of the best ways to achieve that is through familiarisation trips, also known as FAM Trips, where tour operators can learn first-hand about the communities. That is why organizing a FAM Trip was one of the main initiatives of the project.

Last October, representatives from different Peruvian tour operators gathered in the Río Abiseo National Park and Amarakaeri Communal Reserve to discover all the wonderful experiences the communities have to offer.

## Commitments to save the Blue Heart of Europe

Freshwater conservation was in the focus at the CBD COP15 Biodiversity Summit in Montreal, when IUCN hosted a side event on "Conserving the Vjosa-Aoos River", with participation of Mr. Ryan Gellert, CEO Patagonia, H.E. Dr Mirela Kumbaro, Minister of Tourism and Environment, Albania, H.E. Mr. Georgios Amyras, Deputy Minister of the Hellenic Ministry of Environment and Energy, IUCN's Europe and North America Directors, among others.

The event promoted and recognized new partnerships, collaboration and support to turn the design and designation of conservation areas into continuous and successful results for people and nature. It demonstrated real tangible action to secure the integrity of the whole Vjosa-Aoos River in Albania and Greece and new commitments were made to protect this unique and valuable freshwater system, including a pledge by Greek Deputy Environment Minister Georgios Amyras for full protection of Aoos River.

## Vision, roadmap and feasibility study presented for pioneering freshwater conservation in Albania

A vision, roadmap and feasibility study for the protection of the Viosa River and its free-flowing tributaries under the IUCN Category II management classification, have been presented to the Albanian Government. During the last six months, a team of 30 Albanian and international experts, together with representatives of IUCN, Patagonia and EcoAlbania, conducted in-depths analysis on geomorphology, ecology, boundaries, planning and management, sustainable financing, legislation, eco-tourism and social and environmental impact assessments for the successful declaration of Europe's first Wild River National Park. The study, currently out for one month of public consultation, sets out the boundaries for Phase I of the National Park declaration, expected this spring, as well as a vision for its expansion in its second phase.
