IUCN OCEANIA CONSERVATION FORUM 2024 FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Part 1: General Information

What is the IUCN Oceania Conservation Forum (ORCF)?

The Oceania Regional Conservation Forum (ORCF) is a collaborative event organized by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), co-hosted by the Government of Fiji through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (TBC), and in partnership with the Australian National Committee and the New Zealand National Committee. The Forum aims to amplify Oceania voices and explore solutions to support the global sustainability agenda.

Why is it important to attend the ORCF?

Attending the ORCF offers opportunities to meet decision-makers, contribute to the decision-making process, develop new partnerships, benefit from exclusive access to IUCN's resources, and engage in Member-only sessions including preparation for the World Conservation Congress 2025.

When and where will the ORCF take place?

Details regarding the exact dates and location of the ORCF are currently being finalized. The event is planned to take place in Fiji, at the Pacific Islands Forum Secretariat Campus in Suva hosted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (TBC). Updates will be provided as soon as they are available.

What are the benefits of attending the ORCF?

Attending the ORCF offers several benefits, including:

- Opportunities to meet decision-makers and influential leaders in environmental conservation.
- The chance to contribute to the decision-making process on key conservation issues.
- Development of new partnerships and collaborations.
- Exclusive access to IUCN's resources and data.
- Participation in Member-only sessions, including preparation for the World Conservation Congress 2025.

Part 2: ORCF Participation, Programme, and Sponsorship Opportunities

Who can attend the ORCF?

The ORCF is open to:



- IUCN Members.
- Representatives from governmental and non-governmental organizations.
- Indigenous groups.
- Academic and research institutions.
- Private sector stakeholders.
- Other interested parties involved in environmental conservation and sustainability in Oceania.
- Youth Reps & Women Representatives & Civil Society Groups

What is the programme for the ORCF?

The programme for the ORCF will include:

- Plenary discussions and open consultative dialogues including keynote speeches by prominent environmental leaders.
- Panel discussion on pressing conservation issues.
- Workshops and training sessions as side events and pre-conference events.
- Networking events to foster collaboration among participants.
- Member-only sessions focusing on preparation for the World Conservation Congress 2025. A detailed programme will be released closer to the event date.

How can I get involved or contribute to the ORCF?

Participants can get involved by:

- Registering to attend the Forum once registration opens.
- Submitting proposals to host side events for presentations, workshops, or panel discussions
- Participating in pre-Forum consultations and providing input on key topics.
- Engaging with IUCN Members and other stakeholders through networking opportunities.

How can I register for the ORCF?

Registration details will be announced at the ORCF webpage once the event logistics are confirmed. Interested participants are encouraged to regularly check the IUCN website and official communications for updates on registration procedures.

Is there a registration fee for the Pre-conference, the actual conference and side events?

Yes, there is a registration fee for participation. Registration includes access to Plenary (except closed sessions); Partners Consultative Dialogue; side events; information and display booths, pre-conference workshops and meetings inclusive of morning tea, lunch and dinner catered at the conference buffet.
