	Questions	IUCN Answers
1	Is it possible to participate to this Tender as a firm?	Yes, both individual and company are welcome to submit a proposal for this evaluation.
2	The timetable in the ToR indicates that the assignment is expected to commence on 12 August. Is there any flexibility in the starting date?	Applicants are welcome to submit a proposal with a revised timeline, but IUCN highly recommends that they initiate their work as close as possible from the expected starting date. We have estimated that 18-20 weeks will be necessary to complete this evaluation which will need to be achieved by 31 December 2024. In case applicants would decide to suggest a shorter evaluation period, they will need to clearly demonstrate how they intend to deliver this evaluation on time.
3	The document indicates that the project activities have been carried out in 9 African and Asian countries. Could you kindly provide a detailed list of these countries and specify the regions within each country where the evaluation needs to take place?	<p>This evaluation is to be conducted remotely, meaning that traveling to specific location is not required.</p> <p>Countries where national projects have been or are still being implemented are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cameroon • Central African Republic • China • Democratic Republic of the Congo • Guinea Bissau • Kenya (2 national child projects) • Pakistan • Sao Tome and Principe • Tanzania <p>Myanmar was originally part of TRI but the project was ended due to the political instability in the country.</p>
4	Could you clarify the time zone in which the proposal should be submitted?	To be considered, proposal will need to be submitted by 16 July 2024, 23.59 EDT.
5	Is a company that carried out a MTR for this programme eligible to apply for the Final Evaluation.	The only exception where a proposal from an individual or a firm that carried out the MTR of any of the TRI Child project would be considered is when all other competing firms would not be able to submit a proposal that meets our quality expectations.
