

# Oceans Warming Report to be released at Congress



The IUCN Congress marks a unique opportunity to bring together change-makers to develop collaborative solutions to benefit the health of our planet. At this year's Congress, IUCN will release a landmark publication on ocean warming that is the most recent and comprehensive report ever published on the subject.

Bringing together 80 scientists from 12 countries, this report seeks to provide a comprehensive analysis on the impacts to the ocean from absorbing more than 93% of the enhanced heating from the greenhouse effect and other human activities since the 1970s.

The report delves deep into this issue, analysing the impacts on ocean ecosystems, species and even the deep remote ocean. It reviews the impacts and effects of ocean warming on specific seas and ecosystems ranging from micro-organisms up to marine turtles and mammals. The report also examines the impacts on ecosystem services.

The report provides analysis of the existing and likely future economic consequences, including on the weather, the protection of coasts and on the contributions of fisheries and aquaculture. The report also importantly reviews potential risks to human health and well-being.

Finally, the report finishes by detailing what changes are currently underway and what we can expect from the future, with some key recommendations. It should be used to contribute to further discussion and thought on this subject, in particular at high-levels such as in the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, as well as for use by governments, agencies and experts worldwide.

Ensuring the resiliency of our oceans is vital to the planet's survival. Please join us for subsequent important discussions on this report and issue in the Oceans & Islands Pavilion and at other events during the Congress.



