



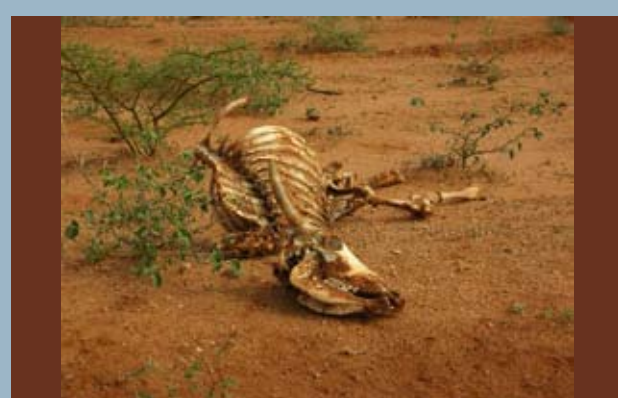
CLIMATE LAW IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES POST-2012: NORTH AND SOUTH PERSPECTIVES

About the Conference

This conference includes speakers and participants from more than 30 countries and all regions of the world, with a significant portion from developing countries. The conference will examine the legal and policy challenges that developing countries face in mitigating and adapting to climate change while meeting their social and economic needs. Speakers from the North and the South will discuss the legislative, regulatory, and policy measures that developing countries are using or could opt for to meet these challenges. The conference also aims to enhance our understanding of how developing countries can position themselves in the ongoing negotiations to develop a new international legal instrument to replace the Kyoto Protocol. The conference will consider what the role of developing countries may be in a post-Kyoto regime, and how to improve the governance of climate-related policy issues within developing countries in order to contribute to sustainability. The conference will also open with a Pre-Conference Workshop on "Teaching Climate Law in Developing Country Universities", which permits the overall research of the conference to be tied into the IUCN Academy's objectives of teaching and capacity building in relation to climate change.

Who Should Participate

The conference will provide a forum for scholars, lawyers, policy-makers, NGOs and other interested persons from the North and South to exchange ideas on the basis of initiatives and lessons learned in their respective countries. The conference will generate new scholarly insights, and will also likely result in substantive legal and policy recommendations for governments and other interested parties.
