

PROCESS OF FORMING WRUAS IN KENYA

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WATER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY STRUCTURAL ESTABLISHMENT

- WRMA National Headquarter-Nairobi
- Catchment Area-Six (Lake Victoria North, Lake Victoria South, Athi, Ewaso Nyiro, Rift Valley and Tana)
- Tana Catchment Area-five Sub Regions (Muranga, Meru, Kerogoya, Kitui and Garissa)
- Garissa Sub Region 5 former Districts(Garissa, Tana River, Ijara, Lamu and Part of Malindi

WATER REOURCES STATUS CLASSIFICATION

- WRMA identifies and classifies status of the sub catchment areas at the sub regional levels as Alarm, Alert and Satisfactory both in water quality and quantity.
- □ Prioritise **Alarm** area for formation of **WRUAs**.
- Desk work on the area is carried out i.e. Data collection
- Compilation of available data e.g. list Boreholes,
 Rivers and pans/ponds

WRUAs

■ What is a WRUA?-A WRUA is an association of water users, riparian land owners, or other stakeholders who have formally and voluntarily associated for the purposes of cooperatively sharing, managing and conserving a common water resource (definition in WRM Rules 2007).

Objectives

- To conserve the water catchments;
- To manage the resources properly;
- To increase the availability of water resources
- 4. To increase the usage of the water for economic and social improvements;
- 5. To develop sustainable and responsive institutions;

WRUAs continuation

Activities

- Exchange of information and ideas on the water resource use;
- Discuss potential projects and developments that may affect water usage with a view to obtain the consent of other WRUA members and the public;
- Resolve conflicts on water use;
- Monitor water availability and use;
- 5. Lobby for resources to improve availability, reliability, quality or other aspects of the water resources.
- Membership-Riparian, Abstractor, Non-consumptive (from informal institution) and observer members (mainly from formal institutions) .e.g

WRUA FORMATION PROCESS

- Identification of stakeholders within the common water resource including civic, Religious & opinion leaders as well as Institutions within the area.
- Organise, plan and mobilise a public baraza with the assistance from Provincial Administration.
- Initial sensitization is done during the Baraza
- Interim committee is elected with the guidance of social officer in conjunction with WRMA (Gender, Zone and membership category representation)
- Regular meetings are held to develop a constitution from WDC draft constitution with the assistance from WRMA.

Process continuation

- Registration of the WRUA with DG&SDO and Societies Act (AG)
- Registration with WRMA
- Capacity building by WRMA
- Writing and signing M.O.U with WRMA
- Proposal writing for funding with assistance from WRMA
- Signing contract with funding organisation
- Receiving funding for proposal
- Implementation of the project

CAPACITY BUILDING AND DEVELOPMENT OF Sub Catchment Management Plan(SCMP)

- SCMP seek to address the following
 - Different uses & users (involvement of multi-stakeholders)
 - Sustainable use & poverty alleviation
 - Ownership, Laws, Conflicts, Gender and Development of agreements
- Capacity building training
- Three days training on WDC overview and process on the 14 Chapters of the SCMP
- Five days workshop on data collection for preparation of SCMP
- 3. Two days for compilation of the draft SCMP by few members
- One day for ratification of the SCMP by all participants

- Provides WRUA Members with a Prioritised Plan of Action & Budget (what to do next?)
- SCMP documents what is known about the sub-catchment
- 3. SCMP provides a basis for Proposals for Funding

SCMP STRUCTURE

What is the SCMP?

- Reflects an integrated way of planning for improved water resource management
- Reflects multi-stakeholder participation
- Provides clarifications of roles in support of common objectives
- Identifies key issues, problems, priorities and interventions
- Supports a mid to long term work plan (3 5 Years)

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

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
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
