- Green infrastructure
 - network of natural/semi-natural areas, features and/or green spaces in rural and urban areas which enhance ecosystem health and resilience, contributes to biodiversity conservation and benefits human populations through the maintenance, enhancement and restoration of ecosystem services
- Working with Nature
- Ecosystem-based approaches to climate change adaptation and mitigation
- other ...

What has been done?

- Initial meeting in January 2009
 - (DG ENV, UK, FR, NL)
- Drafting of a "concept note"
- Principles:
 - Flexibility
 - Scientific underpinning
 - Commitment
 - Recognition of existing mechanisms and instruments
 - Balance between the conservation and development needs
 - Easy Access
- EP Proposal for Preparatory Action and press event on BEST in the margins of CBD COP 10 in Nagoya (EP, Commission, FR and UK) in October 2010

Recent developments:

 December 2010: Budget for Preparatory Action providing 2 million € to be committed for BEST adopted

- 1 March 2011 Financing Decision adopted by the European Commission

Call for proposals

- Indicative Schedule:
 - Publication of the call for proposals: May 2011
 - Deadline for submission of proposals : September 2011
 - Launch projects: November/December 2011
- Applicants must be registered in an EU Member State or in an EU Overseas Country and Territory or be an International organisation.
- Partners from Third Countries are also eligible.

Target beneficiaries are primarily

- public and private bodies in the EU Outermost Regions and Overseas Countries and Territories,
- site managers,
- research institutions,
- non governmental organisations,
- international organisations.

involved in biodiversity conservation and sustainable development actions including also actions for climate change adaptation and mitigation

Projects may include:

- nature conservation measures including designation and management of nature conservation sites;
- measures which facilitate the cohabitation of biodiversity conservation and human activities;
- measures which contribute to the sustainable use of biodiversity and ecosystem services and maintain and develop social and sustainable economic activities which benefit local communities;
- development and use of ecosystem-based approaches to climate change adaptation and mitigation and implementation of green infrastructure;
- networking, education and capacity building activities.

recall BEST objective

Objective of the call:

identify and finance a number of projects to

- showcase the potential multiple benefits of BEST
 - building on existing networks, encouraging new partnerships
- prepare for the establishment a governance structure for a durable implementation of BEST beyond the lifetime of the preparatory action

Evaluation of proposals in 2 steps

- Step 1: overall quality of the project:
 - technical, financial coherence and methodology
- Step 2: contribution to specific objective areas:
 - Conservation
 - Sustainable use
 - Climate change adaptation and mitigation
 - Building partnerships, education, communication
 - Foundation of a governance structure for durable implementation of BEST

summarising

- European overseas entities are an asset
- Biodiversity and climate change are intrinsically linked
- BEST is a possible low input high output scheme with multiple benefits
- Idea is widely accepted
- Preparatory Action is very timely and provides a unique opportunity to demonstrate the value of BEST through real examples and prepare the ground for continuity
- Need for strategic thinking, solidarity and collaboration
