## orimate quick facts

There are currently 634 recognized taxa (i.e., species and subspecies) of primates: 170 in Africa, 96 in Madagascar, 169 in Asia, and 199 in the Neotropics (Mexico and Central and South America).

303 species and subspecies, or 48 percent of all primates, are categorized as Vulnerable (VU), Endangered (EN) or Critically Endangered (CR) on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species, meaning they are at risk of extinction.

Endangered (EN) – 137 species and subspecies, or 22 percent of the total

Least Concern (LC) – 192 species and subspecies, or 30 percent of the total

Data Deficient (DD) - 91 species and subspecies, or 14 percent of the total

Not Evaluated (NE) – 12 species and subspecies, or 2 percent of the total

## THE BREAKDOWN BY GEOGRAPHIC REGION IS:

**Africa** – 63 species and subspecies listed as VU, EN or CR, which is **37 percent** of all African primates

**Asia** – 120 species and subspecies listed as VU, EN or CR, which is **71 percent** of all Asian primates

**Madagascar** – 41 species and subspecies listed as VU, EN or CR, which is **43 percent** of all Malagasy primates

**Neotropics** – 79 species and subspecies listed as VU, EN or CR, which is **40 percent** of all Neotropical primates
